Choose Co-op

STEP 1: Choose the Right Course

- X pick **COP209** for 2 credit (half day) co-op PLUS 6 additional courses
- X pick **COP409** for 4 credit (full day) co-op PLUS 4 additional courses
- X pick **GWL301 & GWL308** for 2 credit (half day) pre co-op PLUS 6 additional courses

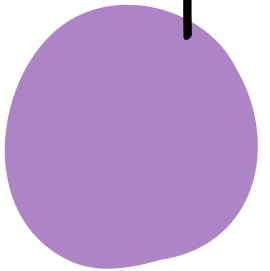
Co-op teachers will place you in the most appropriate course if you have made the wrong choice during the application process.

STEP 2: Submit the Paper Work

- X submit your completed
(1) **co-op application**, and
(2) **resume**
to a co-op teacher.
It can be sent in Edsby or printed and dropped off in guidance.

ND SPARE Policy

*you may be granted a **SPARE** when you are
in grade 12*

AND

have obtained a minimum of 23 credits

you may have a maximum of 1 spare per semester

SPARES: Choosing STUDY Periods

- X You may choose **1** or **2 STUDY periods** in myBlueprint
- X If you choose **2 STUDY periods**, you will have **1 per semester**
- X You may **not** choose the semester or period that your STUDY occurs in
- X **STUDY periods** count as 1 course – *make sure you select a maximum of 8 courses (not credits) including your STUDY period(s) in myBlueprint*
- X If you choose 2 STUDY periods, you will get a **warning flag**, but you will still be able to submit (ignore the warning)
- X Choose **STUDY1** if only returning for semester 2
Choose **STUDY2** if only returning for semester 1



When You're Choosing Courses . . .

- X *read course descriptions carefully to ensure you select what you want*
- X make sure to choose **compulsory courses** before electives
- X choose your **2 alternate courses** carefully as they may be used if your courses conflict or are full
- X grade 9 & 10 students **cannot** make changes to their elective courses
- X **level changes** may occur for all students within the first 2 weeks of each semester if space permits

Grade 12 University Bound Students

- X MUST have **6** grade 12 U- or M-level courses
(your top 6, including program prerequisites, are used for your average)
- X MUST have a minimum of **60% in ENG4U**
- X may take Advanced Placement (AP) courses offered in English, Math and Science.
(the Math & Science programs begin in grade 10)
- X should consider CO-OP and SHSM in grade 11 to support supplemental university applications

Student Submission Process

X issues and flags on your course selection will **NOT** prevent you from submitting your courses

X if you have an issue or flag, you **MUST** explain the issue in the “**Add Comments**” section of the course selection submission process . . .

- **STATE YOUR INTENTIONS TO ENROLL IN SUMMER SCHOOL TO REPEAT A COURSE, ACCELERATE A COURSE, OR TO TAKE A PREREQUISITE COURSE**

Otherwise, your course selection will be adjusted to ensure prerequisites and grad requirements are met.

X once submitted, course selections **cannot** be changed in myBlueprint

Issues & Flags in myBlueprint

Planning on summer school?

Here's what you need to know...

Accelerated Courses

You are eligible if you've

- X never taken the course before and have the prerequisite, or
- X failed the course with a mark below 35%, or
- X passed the course and want to upgrade

Other :

- X 4-week course in July
- X you can enroll in a maximum of 1 course

Credit Recovery Courses

You are eligible if you're

- X repeating a course with a previous mark between 35% to 49%

Other:

- X 2-week course in July
- X you can enroll in up to 2 courses

Summer School courses are run by Continuing Education, not Notre Dame CSS.
After June, all questions and concerns should be directed to Con-Ed as
ND Guidance Counsellors do not work during the summer months.

1. Do **NOT** include the course you plan to take in summer school in your course selection.
2. Add a course you would like to take in its place.

To add a new course, use the filters in the course catalogue of myBlueprint.

3. State what course you will be taking in summer school in the “Add Comments” section during the course selection submission.
4. Complete the **Summer School Registration Form** available in myBlueprint or the Course Selection page of the Guidance Website.

Online Course Selection with myBlueprint

STEP 1 Log into myBlueprint

- Go to your OCSB Launchpad and click the myBlueprint icon OR
- Go to [notredame.dndb.ca](#) → Click Programs and Services → Click Guidance → Click Secondary Pathway Planning → Under the heading [Use myBlueprint for Course Selection](#) click [myBlueprint](#)

STEP 2 From your Dashboard, scroll down and click [Official High School Plan](#) OR choose [High School](#) from the left navigation menu.

- The [Course](#) tab allows you to view all of the courses offered at ND
- The [Plan](#) tab allows you to plan and choose courses

STEP 3 Add courses for next year.

- In High School Planner, click + [Course]
- In the Course Selection and Details screen, explore the available courses
- click [Add Course](#) when you find the course you want

HINT: The Graduation Indicator will help you keep track of your progress towards graduation. Click [View Progress](#) for a list of specific graduation requirements.

STEP 4 Review your selections when you are ready to submit your courses.

- click the [Review Course Selection](#) and give your course selection one final check
- use the "Add Comments" section to explain any issues/flags on your course selection submission (e.g. taking prerequisites or compulsory courses in summer/high school)

STEP 5 Submit Courses

- carefully review the Details page to ensure that (1) you are meeting the requirements for the courses you have selected, and (2) that the courses that appear are correct
- click on [Submit Course Selection](#)
- You will NOT be able to modify your course selections once they are submitted

STEP 6 Print the Sign-Off Sheet

- after submitting your course selections, click [Print Sign-Off Sheet](#) at the top right
- print and return signed on the collection day
- you can also access the sign-off sheet from the High School planner; if it doesn't show after you've clicked the [Print Sign-Off Sheet](#) button, check the pop-up blocker settings for your web browser

ADDITIONAL APPLICATIONS:

The following courses require an application to be submitted with course selection.

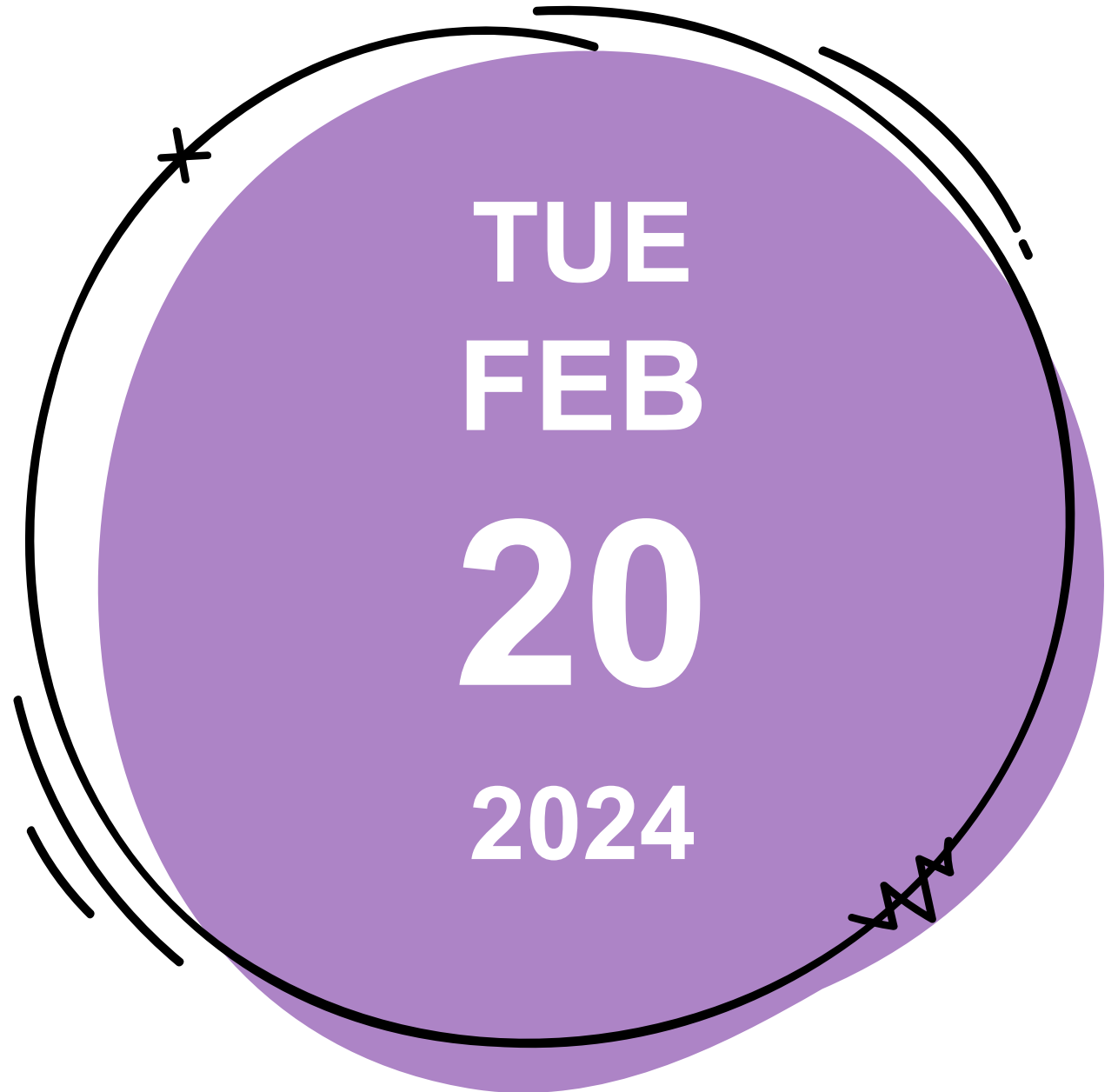

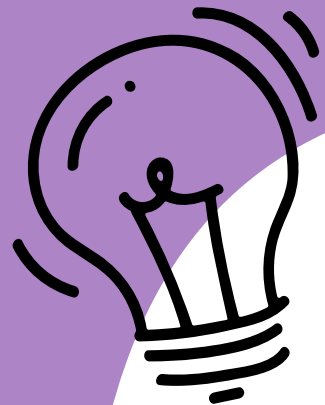
