

university-level curriculum incorporated into academic courses starting in grade 10 for biology, chemistry, math, physics, and grade 12 for English

completion of AP courses until grade 12 establishes eligibility for AP exams

successful scores on AP exams could earn university credits and demonstrate commitment to learning

French Immersion

To be eligible for French Immersion, students must have completed a minimum of 3800 hours by the end of grade 8.

For these students, their French program began in Grade 1.

Students in the French Immersion program must complete 10 courses in French throughout high school.




